Campau Square Plaza

99 Monroe Avenue NW LEED Gold Certified 2010

A Renovation project with many green updates. The Wege Foundation tenants also achieved LEED Gold Certification in 2018 for their Interior Design project renovation.



Campau Square Plaza LOVE Sculpture

This iconic pop-art sculpture by American artist Robert Indiana joined the ever-growing collection of downtown Grand Rapids public art in 2018. It is 1 of over 50 LOVE sculptures around the world and was donated by the Frey family.



Grand Rapids Art Museum

101 Monroe Center NW LEED GOLD Certified 2008

First newly built art museum in the world to achieve LEED Gold certification.



Seeking A Pleasant Peninsula Mural

Located across the street from the Grand Rapids Art Museum is the newly completed ArtPrize 2022 Installation category winner by local artist Maddison Chaffer featuring Michigan native flora and fauna.



Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan Steketee's Building

86 Monroe Center LEED Certified April 2006

The original building was founded by Steketee's in 1862 as Paul Steketee and Sons, a downtown Grand Rapids dry goods store. In 2005, Blue Cross Blue Shield completed a LEED Certified renovation of the long-vacant department store.



CityFlats Hotel

83 Monroe Center NW LEED Gold Certified March 2009

The second hotel in the state of Michigan to be LEED certified. The first was CityFlats in Holland Michigan.



TowerPinkster Buiding

4 Fulton Street E LEED Platinum 2009

The original building built in 1949 was known as the Davenport Building. Tower Pinkster restored 4 Fulton Steet E in Grand Rapids to its original, minimally-detailed, art deco style while achieving LEED Platinum status.



Fountain Street Church

24 Fountain Street NE Grand Rapids 2030 District - Energy Audit Participant 2019

Partnered with the Grand Rapids 2030 District in 2019 to receive an Energy Audit through their Energy Audit Assistance Program.



Federal Building Renovation/Kendall

La Grande Vitesse Sculpture- Calder Plaza

A public sculpture by American artist Alexander Calder is located on the large concrete plaza surrounding City Hall. Popularly referred to as simply "the Calder", since its installation in 1969 it has come to be a symbol of Grand Rapids and an abstraction of it is included in the city's official logo.



Motu Viget Sculpture

Near Calder Plaza

Commonly known as the Tire Swing, the sculpture is titled after the city's motto, a Latin phrase that means "strength in activity." It was installed in 1977. Created by sculptor Mark di Suvero
